- 4) Choreographed exhibit presentation



Witness Examination

- 1) Less ability to surprise
- 2) Conveying credibility
- 3) All remote or all in person
- 4) Preparation of witnesses more difficult





Jury Considerations



- 1) Access to technology
- 2) Residential settings, i.e. kids learning from home, etc.
- 3) Lack of diversity of pool
